VEVIBA : additional recall of minced meat and oxtail

1 Recall of oxtail : butcher shop Amar

Following the tracing of products marketed by VEVIBA, it appears that butcher shop Amar in Anderlecht, in addition to the minced meat from VEVIBA's meat cutting plant, has also sold bulk quantities of oxtail originating from the same plant.

The tracing of VEVIBA's oxtail has been finalised. The oxtail that is currently available in shops is safe for consumption.

2. Recall of minced meat: VEVIBA's meat shop

Following the tracing of products marketed by VEVIBA, it appears that VEVIBA's meat shop in Bastogne has sold 41kg of minced meat originating from the company's meat cutting plant.

**The tracing of minced meat from VEVIBA has been finalised.
The minced meat that is currently available in shops is safe for consumption.**

Information for consumers

The minced meat and oxtail that are sold in butcher shops are examples of non-prepacked foodstuffs. Consequently, batch numbers are not required for these meat products that are sold in butcher shops. This also explains why no batch numbers were communicated.

Consumers must not consume any of the aforementioned products.
Should consumers experience digestive problems following the consumption of tainted meat, the Food Agency advises them to consult their physician.
